RELATIONSHIPS



- Enrich student experiences by engaging Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people from within the school community in teaching and learning programs.



- Embed Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures' histories, cultures and reconciliation into teaching and learning.
- Explore Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander current affairs and issues with staff, students, and community members.
- Engage students, staff and community members in commemorating days of significance.



- Embed the Australian Curriculum 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories and Cultures' cross-curriculum priority into teaching and learning.
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures are inherent in curriculum planning, implementation, and assessment.

RESPECT



- Engage staff in developing knowledge and understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures.
- Provide opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander persons to engage with committees and school-based groups.
- Provide opportunities for staff, students, and community members to collaborate on and contribute to whole-school reconciliation projects.
- Engage Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander elders to share with staff, students and community members in the histories and cultures of the local area.



- Embed Acknowledgement of Country into meetings and events.
- Enhance the school environment to visibly demonstrate respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.



- Verify procedures are inclusive of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, and cultures.
- Ensure staff are provided the opportunity to engage in the progress of the Reconciliation Action Plan.

OPPORTUNITIES



- Coordinate a Welcome to Country for significant events.
- Celebrate National Reconciliation Week each year.
- Invite Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander parents, family members and community members to contribute to significant events and decisions around cultural responsiveness.
- Build relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community groups and representatives.



- Display Aboriginal flag, year-round, and Torres Strait Islander flag at significant events.
- Respect towards Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures and peoples reflected in values and procedural documents, reflecting a zero-tolerance approach to racism.



- Celebrate Reconciliation Plan progress throughout the school and community.
